

## Notice of Proposed Relocation of the Office, Chambers and Courtroom of Magisterial District Court 31-1-02

Notice is hereby given that the Court of Common Pleas of the 31<sup>st</sup> Judicial District of Pennsylvania (Lehigh County), by and through its President Judge, Edward D. Reibman, proposes to request the authority of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania to relocate the office, chambers and courtroom of Magisterial District Court 31-1-02 to the Old Lehigh County Courthouse at 501 West Hamilton Street, Allentown, Pennsylvania.

The boundaries of Magisterial District Court 31-1-02 are 7<sup>th</sup> St at Hamilton Street North to W. Gordon Street to 17<sup>th</sup> street, north to Roth Avenue at Congress Street, Roth Avenue to Albright Avenue, Albright Avenue South to Pennsylvania Street to N. 22<sup>nd</sup> Street, N. 22<sup>nd</sup> Street south to Liberty Street, west to 25<sup>th</sup> Street south to Parkway Blvd east to Linden Street, east to 19<sup>th</sup> street south to Hamilton Street. Those boundaries will remain unchanged; however, the proposed relocation, if approved, will mean the offices, chambers and courtroom of Magisterial District Court 31-1-02 will be located in the Old Lehigh County Courthouse, 501 West Hamilton Street, Allentown, Pennsylvania, which is outside the boundaries of Magisterial District Court 31-1-02 from which the Magisterial District Judge is elected.
